

The Spark Good Local grant program is designed to support local organizations that meet the unique needs of the communities where Walmart and Sam's Club operates, build pride among all associates, and deepen relationships with our customers and members.


Each year, Walmart U.S. stores, Sam's Club and Distribution Centers award local cash grants ranging from \$250 to \$5,000.


Before submitting a grant, organizations must review the guidelines.





- 1. On Walmart.com/nonprofits click "Access Spark Good" and select your entity type.
- 2. You will be prompted to signin to your Spark Good account
- 3. Select the organization name in the Spark Good lobby you want to apply for the grant
- 4. Select "Spark Good Grants" under Charitable Tools











Application Experience

From your Spark Good account, you will have access to your organization's dashboard and local grant application history.




Organizations can monitor status of applications in real time.

NOTE: There is a limit of 25 apps in the system at one time. This includes pending (*yellow*) and approved (*green*) status.



Find facilities in your community. This program is intended to support local organizations in the same service area.

*Defaults to your Zip Code but you can search by zip code or City, State (Fayetteville, AR).



Step by Step guidance help you track the application submission progress.

Make sure your grant is free of mistakes before the grant is submitted. No edits allowed after submissions

If a grant is recommended for funding, you will receive an email with instructions for how to submit electronic banking information.

Only the **Primary User** on your Spark Good account can enter the banking information.







- Enter Account & Routing Number
- Review all the details carefully before you click "Submit."

Be careful not to submit extra zeros or spaces.

Step 3: Confirmation

You will receive an email once payment has been processed which can take up to 3 business days

What does local mean when applying?

Your organization can request grants from facilities in the communities your organization serves through your programs



Is there a limit to how many times we can apply?

Each organization
can have a
combined total of 25
pending and/or
approved grants at
one time in the
system



How many times can my org receive funding?

Each organization can be funded by a facility once per fiscal year



How do I know if payment was sent?

Log back into your local grants portal and check the grant dashboard

To track this total: add the # of apps that are in pending (yellow) and approved (green) status from your grant dashboard





The Storefront Reservation program allows local organizations to request space outside of Walmart stores and Neighborhood Markets for community awareness campaigns. For Sam's Club requests, please contact the local club manager to request the use of space.










Steps for organization listed on the IRS Business Master File or in the NCES database

- 1. Click "Access Spark Good" and select your entity type.
- Sign-on to your Spark Good account on Walmart.com/nonprofits
- 3. Select the organization name in the Spark Good lobby you want to submit a reservation
- 4. Select **"Storefront Reservation"** under Charitable
 Tools














Steps for community groups NOT on the IRS Business Master File or NCES database

- 1. Click "Access Spark Good" and select your entity type.
- Sign-on to your Spark Good account on Walmart.com/nonprofits
- 3. Complete your profile and questionnaire for manual review

Note: Turnaround time is 6-8 weeks for verification of Local Groups









Application Experience

From your Storefrontt account, you can submit, manage, and view event history.




Complete the form clearly outlining the description of your event



Find facilities in your community. This program is intended to support local organizations in the same service area.

* Defaults to your Zip Code but you can search by zip code.



You must click on the term agreements link before checking the box.

Note: Managers reserve the right to decline an organization's request based on review of the organization's reputation and activities and its agreement to comply with applicable terms and conditions.



Most frequently asked questions

These are the top 5 questions asked during webinars, help desks and email inboxes



Can organizations request and event inside the store?

No, local organizations can only request space outside a Walmart facility.



How much advance notice is needed to request an event?

An organization must submit a request no less than 21 days in advance of an event date. This is to ensure that store managers have sufficient time to review the space request.



How long will it take for an event to be reviewed?

Facility management review events and make recommendations on all submitted events. Each facility manager may set the frequency and process in which determinations are made. The organization will be notified of the status of a space request no less than 7 days before their event date.



How many times a year can an org. submit an event?


Organizations may request and use space outside a but no more than 3 consecutive days (and no more than 8 consecutive




What kind of events can an organization host in front of the store?

Organizations may host events for fundraising or community awareness events. Events are not to be submitted for for-profit commercial sale of products or services to the public.


And thank you to all of the people who bought popcorn or made donations to the two units. Thanks to you customers, we sold out of our products in about two hours.

Onboarding Checklist

Checklist on how to get started with Walmart Spark Good Programs

This checklist is applicable for 501c3 Public Charities, NCES Schools, Government Entities and Other Nonprofits

Scenario: You are an organization that is ready to engage with Walmart Spark Good giving programs for the first time!

Step 1: Set up your Spark Good Portal Account

- Start at Walmart.com/nonprofits, Click "Access Spark Good" and select your entity type.
- □ Create your Walmart.com account.
 - Use an email assigned by the organization instead of your personal email.
 - . Note: This same email address needs to match when you set up your Deed account in Step 3.

Step 2: Connect your organization to your Walmart Spark Good Portal Account

- To connect your organization to your portal account from the organization list page (lobby), click "Add organization" to claim your profile and complete your verification with Deed who authenticates your organization and users.
- ☐ If you have multiple locations, you will be able to create chapter accounts. Read <u>here</u> to learn

Step 3: Claim your profile and create a Deed account

- Organizational information (mission statement, board members, contact information and website)

How do I know if I've completed all the steps?

- Click through every Deed pop-up and provide all the information needed in each pop-up Under "Settings," check the "Payments" tab and make sure that PayPal/Network for Good is setup.
- Under "Companies", check that your organization is affiliated with Walmart. Review users in Deed under Settings > Users to make sure that they have appropriate access to
- - Owner | Admin → Primary Users in Spark Good
 - Organizers and Ambassadors → Secondary Users in Spark Good

Step 4. Return to Walmart Spark Good Account

Click "In Partnership with Walmart" logo at the top of the screen to return to Walmart Spark Good Portal account to start engaging with Spark Good programs.

Step 5: Engage with Spark Good programs on your Spark Good Account


