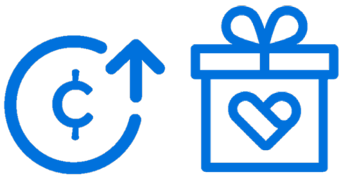

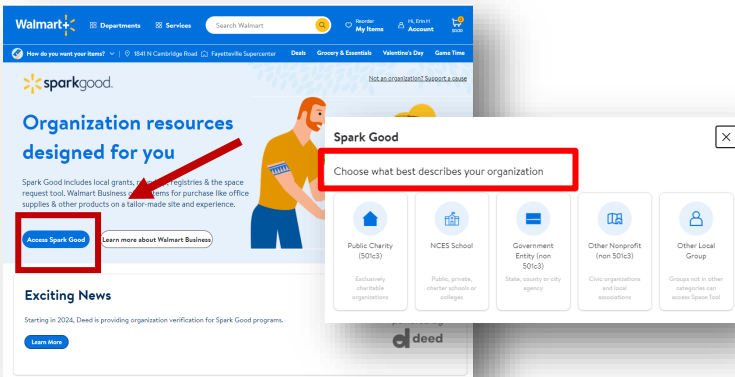
Walmart and Sam's Club associates can volunteer and give to organizations they care about through the Spark Good associate platform.

Onboarding

3 steps to get started with Spark Good

Step 1



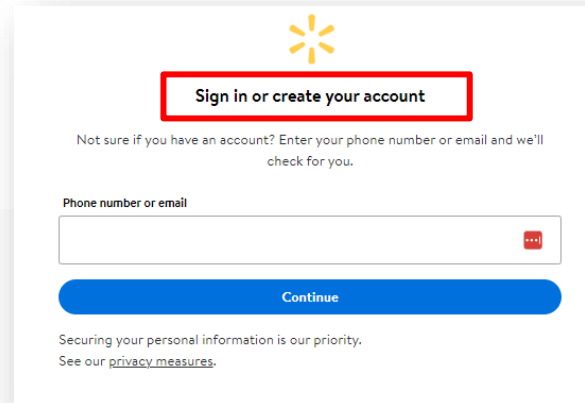
Create a **Spark Good account** at Walmart.com/nonprofits

Click “**Access Spark Good**”

Select your entity type.

- **Public Charity (501c3)** – e.g. NWA Food Bank
- **NCES School** – Public, private schools will have a NCES School ID.
- **Government Entity (non 501c3)** – State, count or city agency (e.g. Sheriff Dept, Fire Dept)
- **Other Nonprofits** – Civic orgs or local associates (501c6, 50c9 organizations)
- **Other Local Group** – Groups not on the IRS Business List.

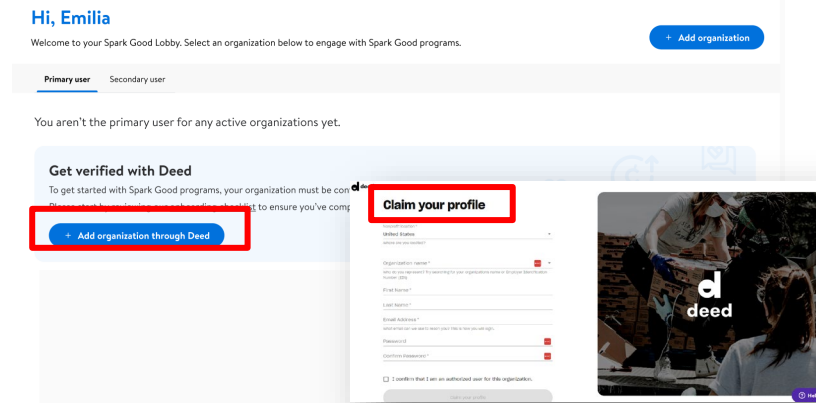

Sign in or create your **Walmart.com account**.

**Make sure you log in using your organizational email address.*

Step 3



Click “**Add Organization**”


It will take you to Deed to claim your organization.



Document requirements by entity type

PUBLIC CHARITIES

- PayPal Giving Fund credentials
- Official IRS documentation such as a determination letter or government letter
- Organization information

NCES SCHOOLS

- PayPal Business credentials (Optional)
- Role within school
- Cancelled bank check or bank letter dated within the last 2 years

GOVERNMENT ENTITIES

- 4076c or document that your department is recognized by your local government
- Role within organization
- Cancelled bank check or bank letter dated within the last 2 years

OTHER NONPROFITS

- PayPal business credentials
- IRS determination letter

Onboarding Checklist

Checklist on how to get started with Walmart Spark Good Programs

This checklist is applicable for 501c3 Public Charities, NCES Schools, Government Entities and Other Nonprofits.

Scenario: You are an organization that is ready to engage with Walmart Spark Good giving programs for the first time!

Step 1: Set up your Spark Good Portal Account

- Start at Walmart.com/nonprofits. Click "Access Spark Good" and select your entity type.
- Create your Walmart.com account.
 - Use an email assigned by the organization instead of your personal email.
 - Note:** This same email address needs to match when you set up your Deed account in Step 3.

Step 2: Connect your organization to your Walmart Spark Good Portal Account

- To connect your organization to your portal account from the organization list page (lobby), click "Add organization" to claim your profile and complete your verification with Deed who authenticates your organization and users.
- If you have multiple locations, you will be able to create chapter accounts. Read [here](#) to learn more.

Step 3: Claim your profile and create a Deed account

- To complete the verification process, the **Owner | Primary User** will need:

- Official IRS documentation such as IRS determination letter and government letters
 - Organizational information (mission statement, board members, contact information and website)
- How do I know if I've completed all the steps?**
- Click through every Deed pop-up and provide all the information needed in each pop-up.
 - Under "Settings," check the "Payments" tab and make sure that PayPal/Network for Good is setup.
 - Under "Companies," check that your organization is affiliated with Walmart.

- Review users in Deed under Settings > Users to make sure that they have appropriate access to Walmart Spark Good.
 - Owner | Admin → Primary Users in Spark Good
 - Organizers and Ambassadors → Secondary Users in Spark Good

Step 4: Return to Walmart Spark Good Account

- Click "In Partnership with Walmart" logo at the top of the screen to return to Walmart Spark Good Portal account to start engaging with Spark Good programs.

Step 5: Engage with Spark Good programs on your Spark Good Account

- From your Walmart.com/nonprofits portal account, click your organization name to enter your program dashboard to engage!

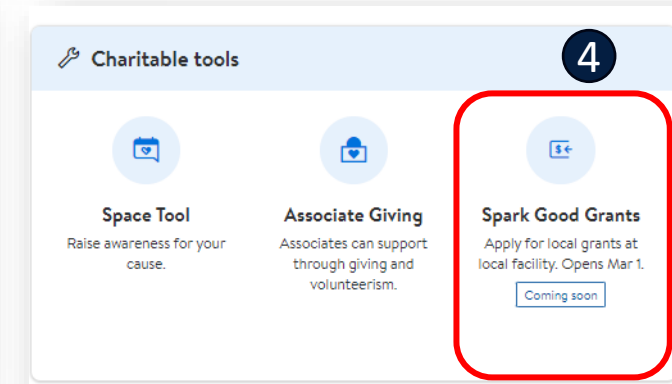
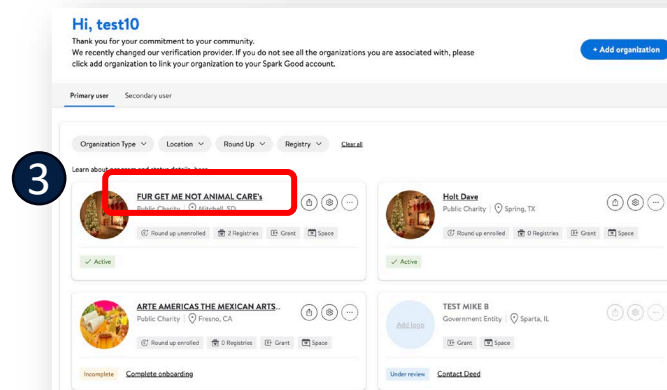
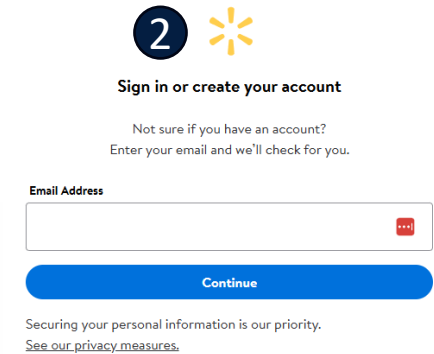
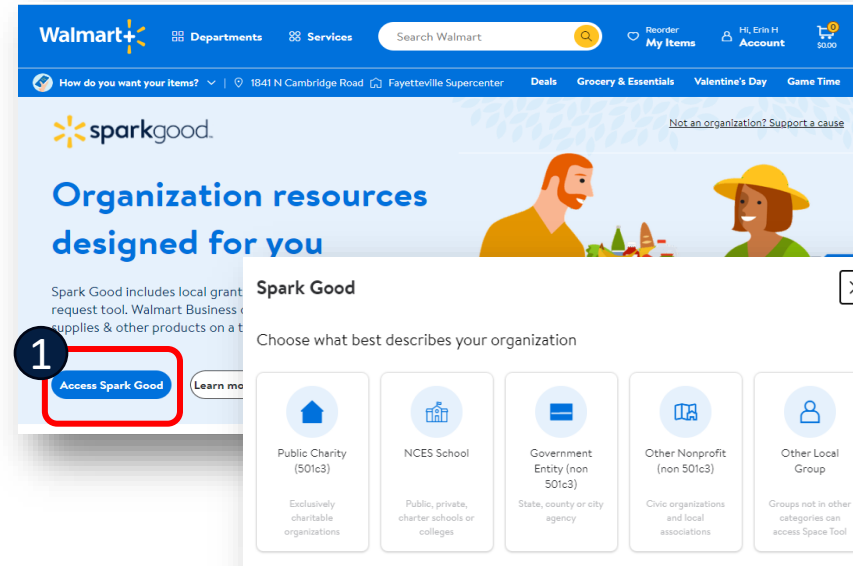
Walmart believes that investing in local communities strengthens our business as well as the communities we serve. Local grants are designed to support local organizations that meet the unique needs of the communities where we operate, build pride among all associates, and deepen relationships with our customers.

Each year, Walmart U.S. stores, Sam's Club and Distribution Centers award local cash grants ranging from \$250 to \$5,000.

Before submitting a grant, organizations must review the guidelines. Applications open in March.

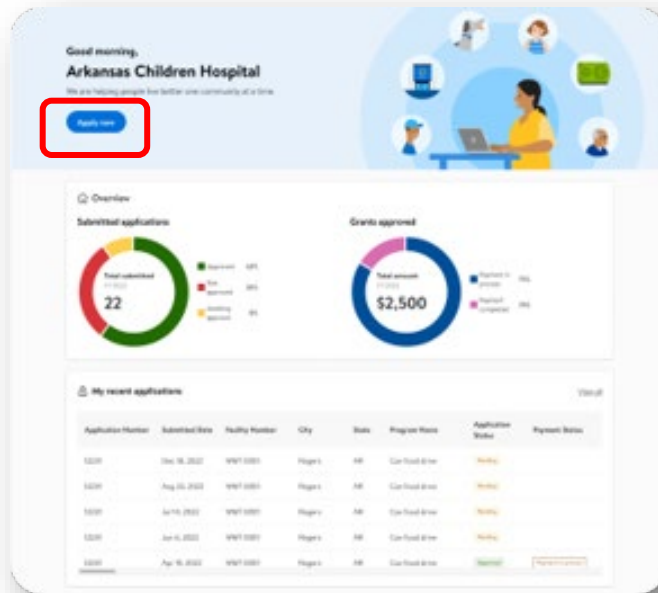
How to access the Spark Good local grant application

1. Click “**Access Spark Good**” and select your entity type.
2. Sign-on to your Spark Good account on Walmart.com/nonprofits
3. Select the **organization name** in the Spark Good lobby you want to apply for the grant
4. Select “**Spark Good Grants**” under Charitable Tools

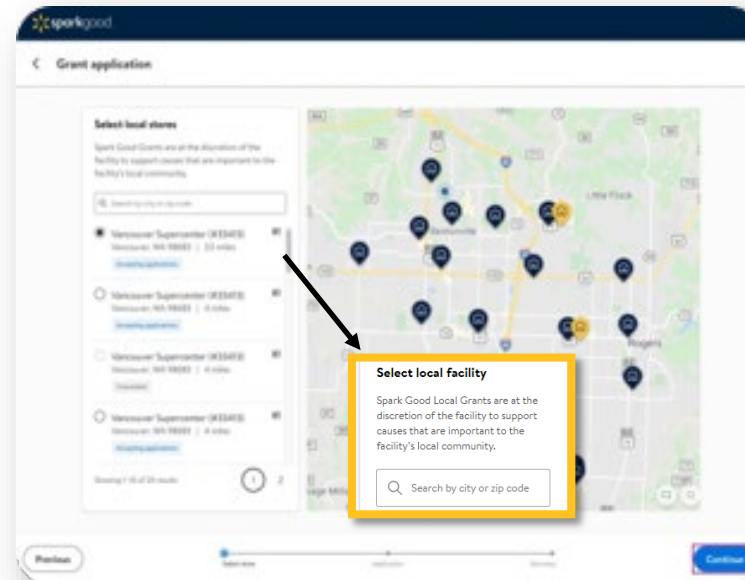


Application Experience

From your Spark Good account, you will have access to your organization's dashboard and local grant application history.




Organizations can monitor status of applications in real time.

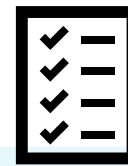
Application Deadlines - Can you help clarify?

Deadlines are application cycles to ensure grants are reviewed before the start of the next cycle



What does local mean when applying?

Your organization can request grants from facilities in the communities your organization serves with your programs



Is there a limit to how many times we can apply?

Each organization can have a combined total of 25 pending and/or approved grants at one time in the system

To track this total: add the # of apps that are in pending (*yellow*) and approved (*green*) status from your grant dashboard



How many times can my organization receive funding?

Each organization can be funded by one facility once per fiscal year




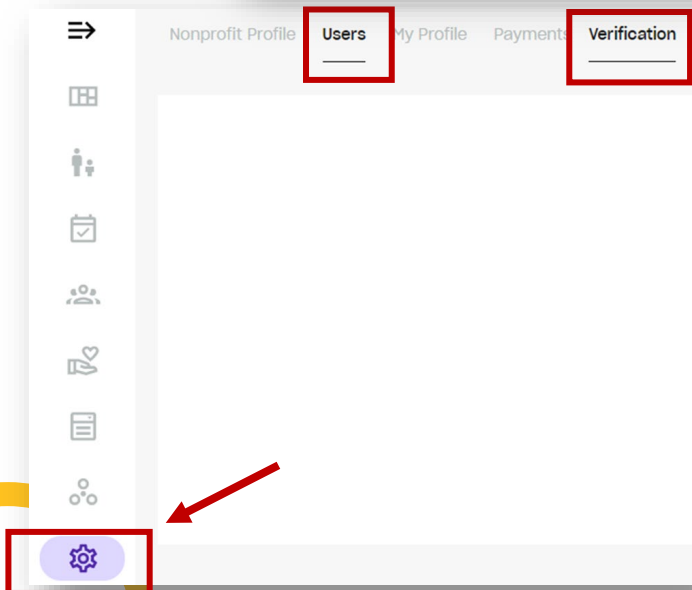
Troubleshooting

Organizations need at least one Owner Admin

If one of the scenarios below apply to your organization, follow the steps to add an Owner Admin.

- **Missing verified owner:** follow instructions on banner in Deed
- **Missing Admin:** follow instructions on banner in Deed to promote a user
- **Admin has left the organization:** promote an existing user to admin

 Your organization is missing a verified owner. Owner verification is the process of having an admin enter the organization's PayPal credentials in Deed. To complete owner verification, click 'Verify with PayPal'. Failure to complete owner verification will result in all current [Verify with PayPal](#) users becoming blocked. This will affect your organization's access to Spark Good programs until owner verification is complete.



How does an Admin become verified?

- **Public charities & Other nonprofits:**
 - Admins enter PayPal credentials on verification tab
- **NCES schools & Government Entities:**
 - Upload requested documentation from onboarding tracker (Role & Cancelled check/ Bank Letter)

If your admin has left the company, existing users can promote their role (from an Organizer to Admin). In Deed, click the verification tab under Settings and follow instructions.

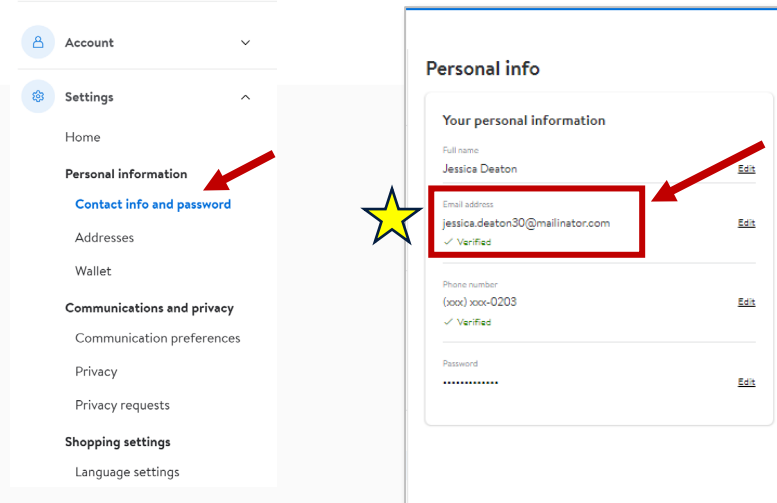
- If the current users listed cannot complete verification and you need to add a user, email nonprofits@joindeed.com to have an admin added to your account including your Org name, EIN and primary contact information

If your Spark Good lobby does not look like you anticipated:

- **Accounts need to sync:** wait 24 hours after completing onboarding in Deed for accounts to sync
- **Emails are not matching:** check the email you are logged into for Walmart and Deed

Important: Your email is what connects your Spark Good and Deed accounts. Make sure you are logged in with the right email address.

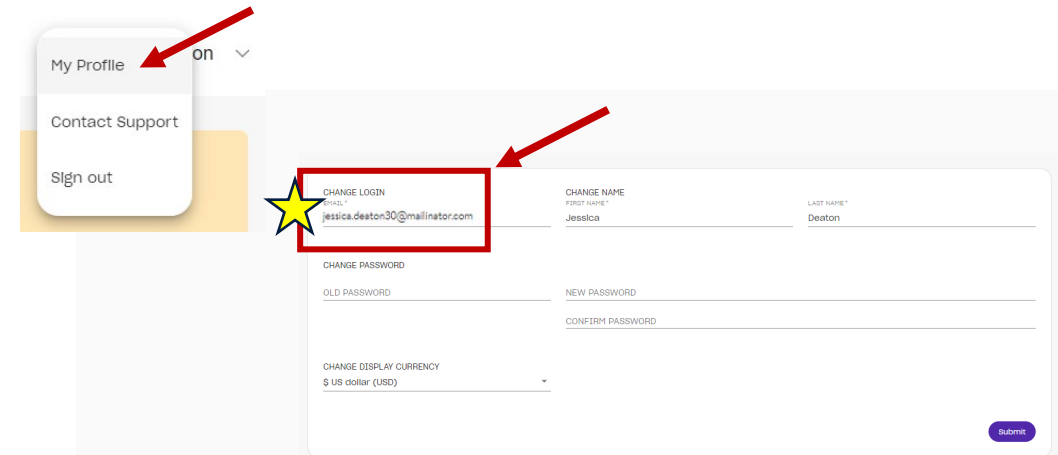

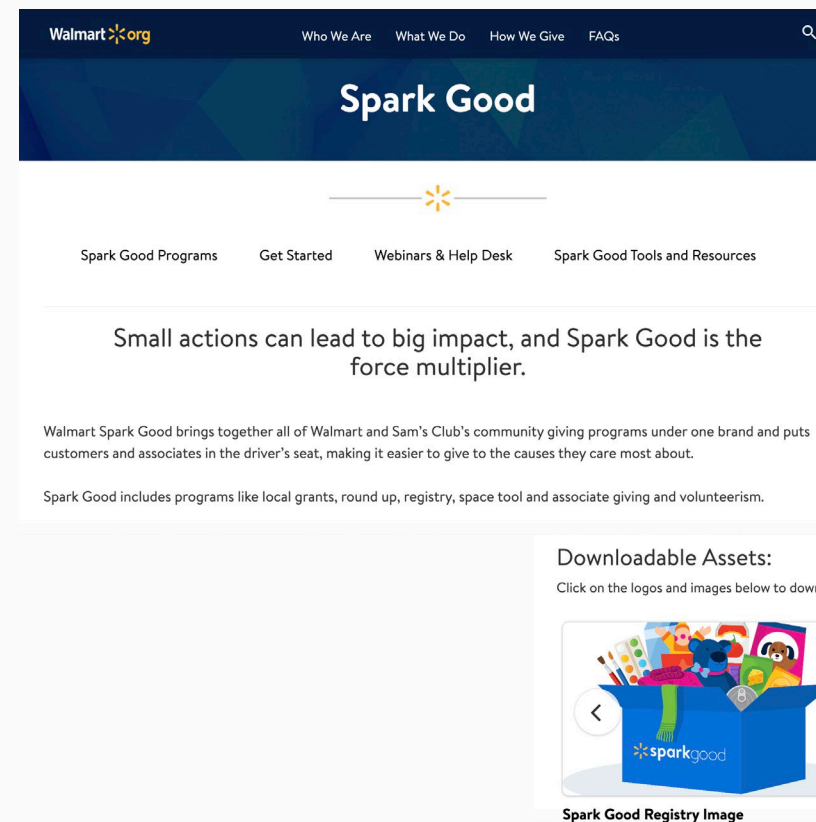
